Gulliver's Travels is a 1939 American adventure-comedy film. The story begins in Bermuda, where Gulliver rents a boat and travels into the triangle. After falling asleep on his ship, he's caught in a freak storm and the boat is overwhelmed by a waterspout. He ends up washing up unconscious on the shore of Lilliput, where he is immediately confirmed as a "beast" and seen as the "giant on the beach" by the town's tiny people. After the citizens claim him to be dangerous because of his huge size, he is captured and imprisoned in a cave. Here, he meets another prisoner named Horatio who was jailed by General Edward because he loves Princess Mary of Lilliput. After the island across from Lilliput infiltrates commandos to kidnap the Princess, Gulliver manages to break free of the machine he is forced to work and rescues the princess from being kidnapped. Gulliver also saves her father, King Theodore, from a fire. Gulliver is declared a hero by Lilliput's citizens and makes up plenty of lies that make him seem to be a more powerful and successful person than he really is. Edward, however, becomes enraged by the new luxurious accommodations and honor that have been given to Gulliver. The next day, chaos ensues as the Blefuscudian Navy lays siege to the city. Edward shuts down its defense system as an act of revenge for Gulliver's treatment. Gulliver defeats the armada, despite numerous cannonballs being fired at him. The Blefuscudians invade Lilliput with the help of Edward and make Gulliver admit to the people of his low ranked and unsuccessful reality and how he made up stories. Edward banishes Gulliver to the shores of "the island where we dare not go". There, he is snatched up by a "little" girl who towers over him. In the end of the film, Horatio finds Gulliver after being spurned by Mary. Gulliver ultimately escapes narrowly with him and goes home.
