Simon Templar, known as the Saint for his use of Catholic saints as aliases, is an international thief who will steal anything for the big bucks. His latest assignment gets him into conflict with Russian oil billionaire Ivan Tretiak, in which he steals a microchip from. When Tretiak learns of the heist, he decides to hire Simon as he had seen what his abilities were first-hand. He pays him to steal a revolutionary cold-fusion formula that could create clean and cheap energy. With this formula, Tretiak plans to monopolize the energy market in Russia and overthrow the Russian president. Using the aliases "Thomas More", Simon seduces American scientist Emma Russel and steals the formula from her. However, when Tretiak receives the formula, he discovers that it is incomplete and orders his son, Ilya, to kill Simon. Emma, once she learned of the theft, reports it to a pair of inspectors at Scotland Yard. She then travels to Russia to track him down. She finds Simon in a hotel in Moscow but is arrested, along with him, by Russian police who are loyal to Tretiak. The pair of them escape and travel through the sewer system to the U.S. embassy. Ilya is waiting for them but Simon allows himself to be caught in order for Emma to escape. Even with Ilya and a bunch of his henchmen guarding him, Simon is able to escape and plant listening devices in Tretiak's room. He learns that Tretiak is going to sell the cold fusion formula to the Russian president and then frame him for wasting billions of dollars on useless technology. Simon tells Emma to complete the formula and delivers it to the president, who has his scientist create a light producing machine. When Tretiak makes his public accusations against the president, he produces the machine and Tretiak gets arrested.
