In Tulsa, Oklahoma, Ponyboy Curtis and his brothers, Darry and Sodapop, live on the poor side of town. They are known as greasers. On the other side of town live their rivals, wealthier kids known as socs. Between these two groups, conflict brews constantly. One night, Ponyboy sneaks into a drive-in movie theater with his friends Johnny and Dally. Two soc girls sit in front of them and Dally tries to flirt with one named Cherry. When Dally leaves, the girls invite Ponyboy and Johnny to sit up with them and then walk them home. However, as they leave the movie theater, the girl's boyfriends, Bob and Randy, pull up and confront them. Johnny recognizes one of them, Bob, as the boy who beat him up previously. To avoid further conflict, the girls leave with their boyfriends and Ponyboy and Johnny go to a nearby park to hang out. They fall asleep by accident and when Ponyboy wakes up, he hurries home but gets in trouble with his older brother Darry, who was worried sick about him. Ponyboy runs away from home and meets up with Johnny again in the park. While they plan on how to run away, Bob and Randy pull up with a bunch of their friends and start drowning Ponyboy in the fountain. Johnny panics and stabs Bob, killing him and making the other boys run away. When Ponyboy regains consciousness, the two realize they have to run so they go to Dally so he can hide them. Dally tells Ponyboy and Johnny to hop a train and hide out in an abandoned church until the coast is clear. Ponyboy and Johnny make it to the church and decide to cut their hair to hide their identity. To pass the time, Ponyboy reads Gone with the Wind to Johnny. After many days, Dally comes to visit the two of them and take them out for lunch. He tells them that Cherry is willing to back them up in court and that Sodapop wants his brother to come back. When they get back to the church, they find it on fire with a bunch of kids stuck in it. Dally tells Ponyboy and Johnny to leave the kids but they decide to rescue them, believing it was their cigarette that caused the fire. The two of them get all the children out but the roof falls on Johnny before he can get out. Dally jumps through the window to rescue him, but he is badly injured. Back home, the greasers prepare for a rumble with the socs. They easily win it and Ponyboy and Dally go to tell the good news to Johnny. However, Johnny is unimpressed and ends up dying, leaving Dally in grief. Unable to handle his death, Dally robs a grocery store and gets shot by the owner. While still alive, he tells his friends to meet him at the park, but the cops get there first. Not wanting to live anymore, he points his empty gun at the cops and they shoot him.

Now, I will answer some questions about the film:
